On behalf of the Board of Directors, Volunteers and Staff, thank you, thank you, thank you!

It is hard at times to understand why God allows situations and circumstances to come to pass, but it is not really for us to understand, but to trust Him in the them. Some of these challenges bring us to our knees when otherwise we would remain self sufficient that ultimately end in defeat. When our abilities to meet the increasing needs within our community and our resources were limited, we bowed our knees to God, and He miraculously demonstrated His power by providing the funds and the volunteers to serve a total of 2,996 men, women and children in 2019. More specifically, 1,193 total households, 374 individuals that were seniors and 1,227 children. This does not include providing emergency shelter care, personal hygiene products, etc. and maintaining three sites! Governor's Grant Awards for Fiscal Year 2020 TANF Funds
dd. Up to Fifty-Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) shall be used to assist The Basement Outreach Ministries with providing emergency housing and recovery support in Trumbull County.

Because of the Governor's Grant Award, the Basement Outreach Ministries will be able to hire staff to implement The Community Outreach Service Program (COSP) which will provide crisis intervention through relocation services for up to a 30-day residential placement at the Terra Alta location. This grant will fill the gap for homeless individuals/families in crisis while eliminating drug usage and will reduce risk for harm and crime. The COSP will also provide crisis intervention through our One Night & Street Outreach services that will offer one overnight stay, shower, meal and referral services to assist in stabilization and residential housing and/or treatment at the Trumbull Homes location that will eliminate drug usage, reduce risk for harm and crime as a result of homelessness.
